Costs: \$750+GST.

Travel: Schools will be responsible for arranging students' transport to and from the Marae as follows:

- ▶ Arrive no later than 9.45am for Powhiri briefing.
Powhiri will be at 10.00am on the arrival date.
- ▶ Pick up time 10.00am on the last day of camp.

All course transport requirements during the camp will be organised for the students.

Cash: Your student may want to purchase some souvenirs to remember their adventure, so it might be a good idea for them to have a small amount of cash for this.

Clothing: We ask that students ensure they pack as much from the clothing list as they can.

Meals: Everyone will be fed all their meals and snacks for the duration of the camp, but please let us know if your student has any special dietary or learning needs on the 'Māori Tourism Cultural Camps Information and Consent Form'.
